The St. Pope John Paul II Tuition Opportunity Partnership (TOP) will also be available to any family who needs tuition assistance for the 2022-2023 school year. 

What is the MOSS Annual Days of Giving?

The Annual Days of Giving helps provide Mother of Sorrows students with the latest and greatest technology. Family, friends, coworkers and businesses have an opportunity to donate money directly to Mother of Sorrows School to help this initiative.

When does the MOSS Annual Days of Giving take place?

This event will take place during Catholic Schools Week. The link to contribute opens on January 30th at 12:01 am and will remain open until February 4th.

What is our fundraising goal?

Our goal is to raise \$30,000. We understand that everyone's financial situation is different, so please contribute what you can. Donations, of any size, are greatly appreciated.

What will the funds be used for?

All money raised will continue our commitment for a one-to-one ratio that has become essential in today's learning environment. MOSS invested heavily in technology last year to overcome the academic challenges caused by the pandemic. MOSS must provide maintenance and fund a technology replacement plan. Additionally, MOSS has hired an IT Technician, from the Diocese of Greensburg, to provide technical support to our staff and students once a week. The annual cost for this support is \$42,000. Having this support person in-house is costly, but extremely necessary.

How can I make a donation?

Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA)

A new club has come to Mother of Sorrows School! Future Business Leaders of America, Middle Level, known by the acronym FBLA, is offered to 6th through 8th-grade students to prepare for careers in business and leadership through academic competitions and leadership development. Forty-three students under the direction of teacher Jennifer Bayer and assistant principal Karen Kolenik are members of the inaugural MOSS chapter.

FBLA is a national organization dedicated to helping students connect, achieve, explore, discover, and inspire. FBLA connects students with similar interests with each other and with the business community. Through FBLA, students can explore new business topics, concepts, and ideas and become leaders and role models.

With mentoring from the local business community, Mother of Sorrows FBLA members are in the process of creating a school store. Joseph Kallen, CEO, and Nick DeMao, CFO and VP of Administration of Busy Beaver Building Centers, assisted the students with the parameters needed to create the store. Students belong to one of five departments: Operations, Finance, IT, Marketing, and Merchandising. Student-driven ideas for the store allow the students to collectively blend the different aspects of the curriculum in a practical manner. The store anticipates opening in March 2022.

FBLA-Middle Level holds a competitive events competition that also prepares students for successful careers in business by providing opportunities to apply classroom concepts in a workforce-simulated competitive environment.

Competing against other middle-level schools across Pennsylvania, students choose from various events to participate. They may decide to take an objective test, perform a role play, give a presentation, or deliver a speech on financial literacy, career research, social media, business etiquette, and leadership.

Finally, FBLA students compete in the Stock Market Challenge, a technology-based stock market simulation in which every 60 seconds represents a day of trading. Beginning with a hypothetical account balance of \$500,000, the Stock Market Challenge introduces students to the fundamentals of stocks.

Eighth-grade student Jordyn Acie describes her FBLA experience. "I think FBLA is fun, and I feel it really helps students prepare for business and college. I like that it helps me be creative. I can be with my friends, and we have the experience of starting the store together."



Did You Know?

Did you know that Mother of Sorrows School is recognized as a Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Distinguished School? It is one of just 158 middle schools across the U.S. to receive this honor for providing broad access to transformative learning opportunities for students through PLTW Gateway. PLTW is a nonprofit organization that serves millions of PreK-12 students and teachers in schools across the U.S.

The PLTW Distinguished School recognition honors schools committed to increasing student access, engagement, and achievement in their PLTW programs. To be eligible for the designation, Mother of Sorrows School must meet the following criteria:

- Have more than 50 percent of the student body participating during the 2020-2021 school year
- Have 25 percent of students advancing to high school participate in two or more units
- Offer at least one PLTW Gateway unit at each grade level
- Have strategies and supports in place that support reasonably proportional representation with regard to race, ethnicity, poverty, gender and can support such claims with relevant data

Reregistration

Reregistration for current MOSS families began on Friday, January 7, 2022. A link was sent to the main family email address on Friday morning. The sender's email address was "Mother of Sorrows School <<coleman@mosschool.org". Please check your junk or spam if you have not received the link in your inbox. If you do not receive the link at all, please contact our Business Manager, Cris Coleman, at ccoleman@mosschool.org. Reregistration will be open until January 28, 2022. New student enrollments will be accepted on January 29, 2022.

<u> Important Reregistration Details:</u>

- Each reenrolling student is charged a reenrollment fee of \$50 when you submit your reenrollment documents. This fee will be credited to your first tuition statement for the next school year. If you decide after paying the reenrollment fee not to attend MOSS, the fee will be forfeited.
- Once the reenrollment is submitted, you will receive an email confirming that the reenrollment was received.
- Any current MOSS family that wants to enroll a new student into the school, will receive a separate email to enroll the "New Student". You will not be able to add the new student using the reenrollment link. The new student enrollment fee is \$95 (non-refundable) and is NOT credited to your tuition account.

How to Make Your Taxes Work for MOSS

Many MOSS families have recently received an email from FundEDU, LLC, a non-profit organization contracted by the Diocese of Greensburg, to secure Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) scholarship program donors.

Pennsylvania allows a very small number of taxpayers to pay their state income taxes locally to the school in the form of scholarships for students. EITC is a crucial funding source for education, and you can make a huge impact by using the tax dollars you pay annually.

Presently, MOSS has 11 EITC donors that contribute \$204,500 in PA tax dollars to assist qualifying MOSS families with financial aid. EITC: WHAT'S IN IT FOR ME?

State Tax Credit

- Pennsylvania allows tax payers to direct their state tax liability to the school and receive 90% tax credit.

Financial Aid Information



Elevating the Education Experience

Option 1: FACTS Financial Aid

The Diocese of Greensburg works with the FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment to help make quality education affordable for families by assisting in awarding financial aid. The FACTS Financial Aid portal is open for the 2022-2023 School Year. You can apply online using the FACTS Grant and Aid Assessment application at: online.factsmgt.com/aid. You may begin the Financial Aid process today. Once your 2021 IRS 1040 tax return AND all supporting tax schedules are completed, you may submit those to FACTS for verification. Those families that complete their Financial Aid application, without the supporting documents, prior to March 15, 2022, will have the \$35 per family FACTS processing fee refunded to them on their 2022-2023 tuition statement. Those families that complete their Financial Aid application after the March 15, 2022 date will be responsible for paying the \$35 FACTS processing fee.

Financial Aid funds are provided by The Scholarship Partners Foundation (SPF) and Parish Supported Financial Aid. The Scholarship Partners Foundation utilizes EITC, OSTC and PKTC contributions for tuition assistance in grades PK-12. Families receiving SPF funds must meet financial requirements.

- When completing the forms, enter "0" for tuition for Mother of Sorrows School. Tuition information is reported to the Diocese of Greensburg, who in turn, reports it to FACTS.
- ATTENTION PARENTS: PLEASE SUBMIT YOUR FINANCIAL AID APPLICATION BY MARCH 15TH AND SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS BY APRIL 15TH IN ORDER TO RECEIVE YOUR TUITION STATEMENT BY JUNE 30TH.
- Preschool students only receive financial aid based on qualification through the Scholarship Partners Foundation. Parents and guardians who apply for aid for their Preschool aged child may receive statements later than K-12 students.
- Tuition statements and award notices are distributed after the FACTS Grant and Aid Assessment is filed and verifying documentation has been received by FACTS.
- Families choosing not to complete a FACTS Grant and Aid Assessment Application for financial aid will be responsible for paying the full tuition charged by Mother of Sorrows School for each child.

Option 2: TOP Scholarship Information (K-8)

A groundbreaking scholarship opportunity has been established for students who wish to attend a Catholic School in the Diocese of Greensburg. The scholarship opportunity is called "The St. Pope John Paul II Tuition Opportunity Partnership (TOP)". The family must demonstrate a financial need and express a willingness to provide some financial contribution to the cost of the education and agree to support the child's academic progress. This will include the completion and verification of the FACTS Grant and Aid application (Option 1 above) so alternative sources of funding, such as EITC assistance, may be used for tuition assistance as well. However, the parent/guardian does not have to qualify for low-income assistance to be eligible for participation in the partnership.

Important TOP Scholarship Information

- The student must demonstrate evidence of academic commitment and an enthusiasm for learning as well as a willingness to participate in at least one activity at the student's local parish or faith community.
- The family, along with the student, must demonstrate their commitment to the school as well as their parish or denominational church through the donation of time, talent, or treasure as able.
- The family must be registered members, of a parish or other local faith community.
- Interested parents or guardians should call 724-552-2565 or visit

 outreach and admissions coordinator to begin the process. Please do not contact Mother
 of Sorrows School directly.
- Returning families must re-apply for the TOP Scholarship.






Mother of Sorrows School Annual Report Fiscal Year 2020-2021

Our school is in sound financial shape. At the end of the last fiscal year, we had a surplus of \$38,867. There is still a loan balance of \$28,353, which will be paid in full at the end of the 2021-2022 fiscal year. The loan originated in June 2020, to purchase one-to-one devices for all MOSS students.

Why does MOSS have three mandatory operating budget fundraisers each year?

 MOSS requires each family to do their best to support three mandatory operating budget fundraisers each school year to avoid a \$300 per student tuition increase. Presently, when formulating an annual budget, a target fundraising profit of \$100,000 is factored into the revenue so that only small tuition increases are made if necessary. The amount of fundraising profit might increase in the future, but currently, this amount serves our needs.

How does the school decide what the mandatory fundraisers are going to be?

• The MOSS Advisory Council and Mrs. Szmed strategically plan what the mandatory fundraisers will be each year. Ultimately, we choose campaigns that will yield high profits (\$20,000 - \$25,000). Last year, we turned to raffles so that there was no social contact during the height of the pandemic to produce the profits needed. This year, we stayed with two raffles and will have one in-person fundraiser, The Designer Purse Bingo, in May. The rest of the fundraising profits come from optional fundraisers (MOSS Marathon, Sarris Candy Sales, Santa Shoppe and Breakfast with Santa) throughout the year.

Who oversees the mandatory fundraisers? Can anyone volunteer to help?

Presently, there are chairpersons in charge of the raffle fundraisers and the Designer Purse Bingo.
The raffle stubs and money are processed through the office by Cris Coleman, the MOSS Business
Manager. The in-person fundraiser, The Designer Purse Bingo, will need many volunteers to help
with the event. Anytime volunteers are needed, we send an email to all our families.

Covid-19 Quarantine Guidelines

Individuals Who Test Positive for COVID-19

Everyone, regardless of vaccination status:

- Stay home for 5 days.
- If the person with COVID-19 either has no symptoms or has resolved or improving symptoms (including no fever) after Day 5, the person may leave the house provided they wear a well-fitting mask when around other people for 5 additional days. Day 0 is defined as either the date of symptom onset, or the date the test specimen was collected if the person is asymptomatic.
- If someone develops symptoms consistent with COVID-19, testing is recommended regardless of vaccination or prior infection status.

Individuals Exposed to Someone with COVID-19

If you have been boosted for at least 2 weeks or completed the primary series of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within the last 6 months and are not yet eligible for the booster vaccination or completed the primary series of the J & J vaccine within the last 2 months. Heterologous (mix-and-match) dosing may occur for the booster dose:

- Quarantine is not required.
- Wear a mask around others for 10 days.
- Test on Day 5, if possible. If positive, follow the recommendations above for individuals who test positive.

If you are unvaccinated or completed the primary series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine OVER 6 months ago and are not boosted or completed the primary series of J & J OVER 2 months ago and are not boosted:

- Stay home for 5 days.
- After that, continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days.
- Test on Day 5, if possible. If positive, follow the recommendations above for individuals who test positive.
- If you develop symptoms, get tested and stay home until the results are received. If someone in your family has symptoms and is being tested, please stay home until test results are received. This can help prevent the spread of COVID-19.

When a Household Member Tests Positive for COVID-19

If the student is not vaccinated:

- He/she will need to quarantine for the same period of time as the person who is COVID positive has to isolate.
- If they have no symptoms after that time, they must continue to quarantine for another 5 days.
- Should the student test positive at any point during the quarantine, he/she must follow the updated guidelines for testing positive.

If the student is vaccinated:

 He/she is permitted to attend school but must wear a mask for 10 days from the date of exposure.

 \$5,000 for their own unrestricted personal use.


