Schoology

What is Schoology?

Mother of Sorrows School, in partnership with the Diocese of Greensburg, uses the Schoology learning management system to assist in the education of our students both in school and at home. This cloud-based platform allows teachers to post daily reminders, new assignments, homework and so much more.

Schoology Student Directions:

Recent Activity:

- "Recent Activity" shows all comments and updates pertaining to your school, courses and groups.
- To filter your feed to view only updates, polls, or blog posts, click the "Most Recent" link in the top corner and select a filtering option.

Course Dashboard:

- The "Course Dashboard" enables you to view all your courses as a titled list.
- From the "Course Dashboard", click any one of your courses to go directly to its main landing page.
- You can also click and drag course tiles to rearrange them.

Upcoming:

- The "Upcoming" area on the right side of your homepage displays events, assignments, tests/quizzes, and discussions with a due date. When you hover over each item, it will display the course or group associated with the item.
- While Schoology has a "Grades" feature, students and parents should still use PowerSchool to access grades.

Search:

• Use the "Search" tool (magnifier icon) to search for your teachers, courses and groups.

App Center:

 Schoology's "App Center" allows your teachers to provide you with access to content and software developed by other companies from directly within the Schoology website.

Calendar:

- The Schoology "Calendar" keeps events and due dates organized and easily accessible.
- By clicking the "Calendar" icon at the top of Schoology, you can view events and due dates by month, week or day.
- Due dates for assignments, assessments and important course related events are automatically added to your calendar and managed by you instructor.

Schoology Student Directions:

Notifications:

- Depending on the settings in place, you may be able to receive messages from teachers and send messages to teachers at your school.
- Navigate to your "Messages" area by clicking the envelope icon on the top menu.
- Click "New Message".
- Enter the recipient's name in the "To" field. A list of users automatically populates as you type.
- Select the user from the list.
- Enter a subject and message.
- Add optional files, links or resources.
- Click "Send" to complete.

Conferences:

- Students who are distance learning will use the "Conferences" feature to "Zoom" into the classroom.
- Students are expected to log in to the "Conference" at 8:30 a.m.
- When a student is not required to be online during the day (lunch, recess...), the student should mute themselves and turn off their video (PLEASE DO NOT LOG OFF).
- The daily "Conference" will be set up by the homeroom teacher. It will appear in the title menu.
- Students should click on the "Microphone" on the next screen.
- The next screen will be the welcome screen.
- At the bottom of the welcome screen, click the "Camera" to start your video.
- Allow the program to access your camera.
- Your name should be included under the user menu.

Creating a Parent Account:

Setting Up Your Parent Account:

- To access Schoology, please go to Schoology.com.
- In the top right, click "Sign Up" and then select "Parent".
- Enter your "Parent Access Code" and fill in your personal information.
- Check the box to agree to the terms and conditions.
- Once in your account, click on "Your Name" in the top right.
- You will see your student's name listed underneath.
- You can select your student for a "View Only" look at their Schoology activity.
- If you need to add more than one student, click on "Your Name" in the top right and select "Add Child" from the dropdown menu to enter the "Access Code" provided to you for the other student.
- Please keep your account information confidential.

PowerSchool

The PowerSchool Parent Portal is Accessible in 2 ways:

1. Website URL:

2. Mobile APP:

- PowerSchool Mobile APP for iOS and Android Devices
- Using the APP requires the user to enter a district code, located on the Parent Portal Homepage, when a user is logged in via the website URL

Important PowerSchool Information:

Students:

- Each student has his or her own login for the portal.
- In order to generate the report for student logins, select the students in PowerSchool, and then choose "Print Report" from the "Functions" dropdown menu.
- Select the report titled "Parent Portal Student Access Letter" and then click "Submit".

Parents without a Parent Portal Account:

- These individuals will need to create an account on the Parent Portal login screen.
- The following file, "Creating a Parent or Guardian Account for the PowerSchool Parent Portal", may be downloaded and provided to parents who need to create an account.
- These individuals will also need the Access ID and Access Password for their children in order to link the student records to their portal account.
- The Access ID and Access Password is generated by selecting the respective student(s) in PowerSchool, and printing the report titled "Parent Portal Parent/Guardian Access Letter".

Parents with an Existing Parent Portal Account:

- These individuals already created an account for the Parent Portal.
- The login information remains unchanged.
- The students that were linked to their account previously will remain intact as well, as long as they are still active in PowerSchool.
- These individuals may have a new child attending our school. In this case, the "Parent Portal Parent/Guardian Access Letter" will need to be generated for the new student and then provided to the parent(s) in order to add the record to their account.
- The following file, "Adding a New Student Record to an Existing Parent Portal Account", may be downloaded and provided to parents for instruction on how to add a new student record to their account.

Student Accident Insurance

What is Student Accident Insurance?

One of the benefits for our students and families is Student Accident Insurance which supplements parents' insurance for certain covered expenses related to an accident. This insurance is in effect during the hours and days when school is in session, and while attending school sponsored and supervised activities. This insurance provides payment of covered, medically necessary expenses, incurred for treatment of injury, caused by a covered accident up to a maximum limit of \$6,000,000 incurred with ten (10) years. The coverage is excess over any other collectible insurance plans. Written notice of a claim must be given to the insurance company within 90 days of the accident. The first medical expense must be incurred within 90 days following the accident. We strive to provide a safe environment for our students; but, unfortunately, accidents do occur. If you need to report an injury in order to request reimbursement through this program, please follow the steps listed below:

- 1. In the event of an accident, notify the school immediately.
- 2. The school will complete and sign Part 1 of the Loss Reporting form, and then forward this form to the parents of the injured student. The Loss Reporting form provides additional reporting instructions.
- 3. The parents will complete and sign Part 2 of the Loss Reporting form in full, remembering to include the name and mailing address of both parents' employers, as well as other information regarding the parents' insurance.
- 4. The claim form must be submitted within 90 days from the date of the injury. It is not necessary to wait for bills to be received in order to send in a claim form on a particular accident.

What is the 24-Hour Accident Plan?

Parents also have the option to purchase 24-Hour Accident coverage to extend the school time accident protection to a full 24 hours a day plan that provides the same benefits against accidents that occur anytime. Parents can enroll students online at **www.BollingerSchools.com** or complete an enrollment form and mail it along with your payment. The annual cost of enrollment is \$88.00. Under the 24-Hour Plan, benefits are payable for expenses incurred up to \$500,000 maximum. If you would like additional information regarding Student Accident Insurance, please contact the school office.

- ✓ CHILLS
- ✓ COUGH
- ✓ SORE THROAT
- ✓ SHORTNESS OF BREATH
- ✓ DIFFICULTY BREATING
- ✓ FEVER (measured temperature with a thermometer of 100.4 or higher)
- ✓ CLOSE CONTACT WITH A PERSON WITH COVID-19

Additional Reminders:

- Students must be fever free and symptom free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication in order to return to school.
- If symptoms persist for more than 24 hours, please contact your child's healthcare provider for an evaluation and written clearance in order to return to school.
- Parents must notify the school of their child's absence and reason for absence prior to the start of the academic day.
- If your child does not display any of the listed symptoms, please have them wash their hands and apply a face covering prior to leaving for school.
- Please note: Students must wear a face covering on the bus and in school.

Drop Off and Pick Up Procedure:

Lunch Duty Procedure:

Parents arriving for lunch duty will first go to the white canopy and ring the doorbell. Someone from the office will open the window to take your temperature and then direct you to the front door to enter the building. This process will take a couple of minutes so please try to arrive by 11:10 a.m. so that you can be on time to assist with student lunches.

What is Scrip?

Looking for a way to reduce your tuition bill? The MOSS Scrip Gift Card Program is a way for you to earn "Scrip Tuition Credit" on things you already buy (gas, groceries, school supplies, clothing and so much more). More importantly, your friends and family can sign-up for their own accounts to support your MOSS family.

Fall 2020 Scrip Changes and Instructions:

You must **ORDER/PAY** for all your Scrip Gift Cards **ONLINE BEFORE THEY WILL BE READY** for "Pick Up" or "Sent Home" on Scrip Tuesdays. Directions on how to order Scrip Gift Cards are listed below:

1. Online Ordering:

 Order and pay for all your Scrip Gift Cards (E-Cards, reloads and physical gift cards) from your computer using your <u>www.ShopWithScrip.com</u> account or the RaiseRight App on your mobile device.

2. Payment:

 Choose the PRESTOPAY option for the FASTEST way to receive your Scrip Gift Cards. E-Cards will be INSTANTLY available for use and RELOADS may be instant or take up to 24 hours. Physical Scrip Gift Cards will take 2 to 7 days depending on when you place your order. Checks must be dropped off in the school office prior to order placement.

3. <u>Earn:</u>

 Your Scrip Gift Card account rebate (split 75/25) will be applied to your family's tuition bill as SCRIP TUITION CREDIT every other month beginning around September 10th.
