
# Gym Uniform and Sweatshirt Order

# Drop Off Procedure

There seem to be many students arriving as car riders in the morning. Here are a few reminders to help make the arrival process run as safe and smoothly as possible.

- When arriving for drop off, please pull up to the Angel Statue in front of the church if you are the first car in the line. Each lead car should pull to the statue after that.
- All children must exit the car from the passenger side.
- If you have to exit your car to assist your child(ren) in getting out of the car, please do not use the car rider line. Please park your car in the lower lot so you can take your time assisting them and avoid holding up the car rider line.
- Please do not go around cars who are dropping off students. No one can pull away until the car in front of you pulls away.

Mother of Sorrows student athletes are embarking on another exciting and fun-filled sports season. Last year, MOS had 182 student athletes participate in the MOS sports programs, with many students participating in more than one sport. Our athletic program philosophy is characterized by the Diocese of Greensburg's "PLAY LIKE A CHAMPION TODAY" *GROW* model of coaches and players working together to set team, individual, and sportsmanship *GOALS*, to establish good *RELATIONSHIPS* with teammates, opponents, coaches, and officials, and to allow the student athletes to have *OWNERSHIP* for their sport, with **WINNING** occurring as a result of these factors (G+R+O=W).

The MOS CYO athletic teams compete with other CYO programs from around the diocese and participate in end-of-season championship tournaments at Greensburg Central High School. This year, the end of season cross country championship meet will take place at St. Vincent University. During the 2021-22 school year, the Mother of Sorrows Cross Country, Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball, and Girls Volleyball athletic teams achieved many first and second place awards at the diocesan tournaments.

- In order to generate the report for student logins, select the students in PowerSchool, and then choose "Print Report" from the "Functions" dropdown menu.
- Select the report titled "Parent Portal Student Access Letter" and then click "Submit".

#### **Parents without a Parent Portal Account:**

- These individuals will need to create an account on the Parent Portal login screen.
- The following file, "Creating a Parent or Guardian Account for the PowerSchool Parent Portal", may be downloaded and provided to parents who need to create an account.
- These individuals will also need the Access ID and Access Password for their children in order to link the student records to their portal account.
- The Access ID and Access Password is generated by selecting the respective student(s) in PowerSchool, and printing the report titled "Parent Portal Parent/Guardian Access Letter".

#### **Parents with an Existing Parent Portal Account:**

- These individuals already created an account for the Parent Portal.
- The login information remains unchanged.
- The students that were linked to their account previously will remain intact as well, as long as they are still active in PowerSchool.
- These individuals may have a new child attending our school. In this case, the "Parent Portal Parent/Guardian Access Letter" will need to be generated for the new student and then provided to the parent(s) in order to add the record to their account.
- The following file, "Adding a New Student Record to an Existing Parent Portal Account", may be downloaded and provided to parents for instruction on how to add a new student record to their account.


# Around the Halls of MOSS
