The production overall is as witty as it is heartwarming, with tremendous comedic timing and a moving musical score. Audiences are in for a real treat.



# PowerSchool

### The PowerSchool Parent Portal is Accessible in 2 ways:

#### Website URL:

- Located on our school website

#### Mobile APP:

- PowerSchool Mobile APP for iOS and Android Devices
- Using the APP requires the user to enter a district code, located on the Parent Portal Homepage, when a user is logged in via the website URL

### Important PowerSchool Information:

#### Students:

- Each student has his or her own login for the portal.
- In order to generate the report for student logins, select the students in PowerSchool, and then choose "Print Report" from the "Functions" dropdown menu.
- Select the report titled "Parent Portal Student Access Letter" and then click "Submit".

#### Parents without a Parent Portal Account:

- These individuals will need to create an account on the Parent Portal login screen.
- The following file, "Creating a Parent or Guardian Account for the PowerSchool Parent Portal", may be downloaded and provided to parents who need to create an account.
- These individuals will also need the Access ID and Access Password for their children in order to link the student records to their portal account.
- The Access ID and Access Password is generated by selecting the respective student(s) in PowerSchool, and printing the report titled "Parent Portal Parent/Guardian Access Letter".

#### Parents with an Existing Parent Portal Account:

- These individuals already created an account for the Parent Portal.
- The login information remains unchanged.
- The students that were linked to their account previously will remain intact as well, as long as they are still active in PowerSchool.
- These individuals may have a new child attending our school. In this case, the "Parent Portal Parent/Guardian Access Letter" will need to be generated for the new student and then provided to the parent(s) in order to add the record to their account.
- The following file, "Adding a New Student Record to an Existing Parent Portal Account", may be downloaded and provided to parents for instruction on how to add a new student record to their account.



#### SMARTSCORE CORNER

#### What is IXL's SmartScore?

The SmartScore is the best possible measure of how well your child understands a skill! It factors in question difficulty, answer accuracy, and consistency.

#### You can adjust SmartScore goals as you go

Aim for 80 or 90, which shows a strong understanding of a skill. For an extra challenge, try for mastery (a score of 100). The SmartScore is not a percentage score

Unlike percentage-based scoring, the SmartScore is truly smart. Even if a student gets a question wrong, it's always possible to reach a 100.

#### Taking breaks is always okay

If your child needs to pause their practice, they can always return to a skill later—all progress will be automatically saved!

# Notes from the Office

### Birthday Dress-Down Passes

Students in kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> grade can celebrate their birthday by purchasing a Birthday Dress Down Pass for their homeroom. The Birthday Dress Down Pass is \$25.00. If you are interested in purchasing this pass, please email Jodi Beall at <u>ibeall@mosschool.org</u> at least one week before the requested date of the dress down. Please note, Birthday Dress Down Passes are not available on Mass days.

### Birthday Treats

All students are permitted to bring in a small birthday treat; however, the treat must be an item from the "Approved Treat List". Also, please contact your child's homeroom teacher before sending in a birthday treat! We appreciate your cooperation in following the rules and keeping our students with allergies safe!

### A La Carte During Lunch

There are a variety of A La Carte items available to students who finish their lunches. A La Carte items must be purchased with cash only. Students should not be purchasing items to give to their friends. Each student is limited to 2 A La Carte items per day.

### Before School Club

The Before School Club is in the school cafeteria. To access the cafeteria, once you enter the campus, continue up the hill and past the school. At the stop sign at the top of the hill, turn left and drive to the cul-de-sac and park. Walk down the driveway to the cafeteria door and ring the bell. The Before School Club opens at 7:15 am. All students must arrive by 8:00 am.

### After School Club

The After School Club is in the lobby (library) of the school. The After School Club is open until 5:30 pm. You can park in the circle in front of the school and proceed through the front entrance and ring the doorbell. On Food Bank days, usually the first Tuesday of each month, picking up a child from the After School Club is a little tricky. Please follow these directions on Food Bank days: Enter the Mother of Sorrows Campus through the Evergreen Drive alley and proceed behind the school to a parking space. Proceed down the cafeteria driveway, walk down the steps, go around the gym, past the FLC and to the school's main entrance. Please exit the campus through the Evergreen Drive alley.

The central theme of this program is the **GROW** Model, which focuses on coaches and players working together to set team, individual and sportsmanship **GOALS**, to establish good **RELATIONSHIPS** with teammates, opponents, coaches and officials to allow the student athletes to have **OWNERSHIP** for their sport with **WINNING** occurring as a result of these factors **(G+R+O+W)**. Every MOS coach must attend a 4 hour **PLACT** coach clinic which covers these and many other related youth sports principles in great detail.

The MOS CYO Athletic Program competes with other CYO programs from across the diocese and participates in end-of- season championship tournaments. During the 2022-2023 school year, the Mother of Sorrows sports teams achieved many first and second place awards at the diocesan tournaments. More importantly, the student athletes had lots of fun throughout the year.

# Important Safety Reminders

### Morning Car Rider Drop-Off Reminders

Here are a few friendly reminders to keep our students safe during their arrival and dismissal from school each day. Morning Car Rider Drop-off occurs in the circle out front of the school. The first car in line in the morning should pull all the way to the angel statue outside of the church. No student should be on the front patio or in front of the entrance doors before 8:10 am. At 8:10 am, adult supervisors will exit the building and students can begin arriving on the patio to enter the school. If you park in Lot A or B, please wait until 8:09 am before leaving your car to walk up to the entrance.

**All students should exit the car on the sidewalk side of the vehicle.** Once on the sidewalk, students should not, for any reason, step back off of the sidewalk. Students should not be riding on the driver/front seat passenger's laps when proceeding to the drop-off point.

Car doors should not be open while the car is proceeding to the drop-off point. Transitional Preschool and Kindergarten students should be dropped off close to adult supervision and not at the top of the hill near the outdoor classroom.

If you need to get out of your vehicle to assist your child, please park in Lot A or B and walk your child to the door.

### Afternoon Car Rider Pick-Up Reminders

Afternoon Car Rider Pick-Up takes place in Parking Lot A and Parking Lot B, the lots below the church. Parking Lot A (the first lot on your left as you enter from Old William Penn Highway) is for families with multiple children attending MOSS. Parking Lot B (the second lot on your left as you enter from Old William Pen Highway) is for families with one child attending MOSS. Please pull into the parking lot and park in a space. You must exit your vehicle and pick up your child at the bottom of the stairs located in the parking lot. No child will be permitted to walk to the car without an adult.

Please exit slowly and move your children away from cars leaving the parking lot.


### <u>Trick or Treat Night</u>
